

# Fidelity Global Equity 50:50 Pensions Fund

## DEFINED CONTRIBUTIONS

### FUND OBJECTIVE

The Global Equity 50:50 Pensions Fund aims to provide long-term capital growth, achieving a return that exceeds the benchmark by active stock selection in a diversified range of UK and overseas equities.

### INVESTMENT APPROACH

The fund adopts an active approach that uses Fidelity's extensive research universe to identify stocks where future potential is greater than that implied by the share price. Portfolio construction is monitored against explicit risk parameters at the stock and sector levels to ensure that outperformance is derived from superior stock selection. The tactical asset allocation of the fund is managed in a tightly defined process that takes small positions relative to the benchmark. The fund invests in a range of sub-funds of the Fidelity Institutional Funds OEIC.

Trevor Greetham graduated from Cambridge University and holds an MA in Mathematics. He joined Fidelity in 2006, as both a Portfolio Manager and Asset Allocation Director.
